

When a person becomes pregnant...

They have 3 options:

- Continue with the pregnancy and parent
- Continue with the pregnancy and place for adoption
- End the pregnancy by having an abortion



Whose decision is it?



The choice belongs to the person who is pregnant and no one else.



History of Abortion in Canada

- 1988 The Supreme Court of Canada strikes down Canada's abortion law, ruling it is unconstitutional because it violates Canada's Charter of Rights and Freedoms by infringing on a woman's right to "life, liberty and security of the person"
- Does Canada currently have laws about abortion?
- What do you think happened before 1988? Were abortions performed?



Abortion in Canada

- Canada does not have laws regarding abortion.
- Abortion procedures are regulated by the Canadian Medical Association.
- People of all racial, socioeconomic, cultural and religious backgrounds have abortions.
- People of various ages and abilities have abortions.
- In Canada you can have an abortion up to 24 weeks of pregnancy.
- In Waterloo Region you can have an abortion up to 13 weeks of pregnancy.
- The majority of abortions occur in the first trimester of pregnancy (under 12 weeks).
- In many countries in the world abortion is illegal.



Abortion in Canada

- You do not need a referral from a physician to get an abortion, you can self-refer, your physician does not need to know.
- You do not need permission from your parents to get an abortion and your parents do not need to know.
- Under proper medical conditions, abortion is a very safe procedure.
- The earlier in your pregnancy the abortion is performed, the safer it is.
- 97% of people who have a first trimester abortion have no complications or any post-abortion complaints.



Abortion in Canada

- For a first trimester abortion the procedure takes less than 10 minutes.
- The emotional response after an abortion is different for each individual because the circumstances of each individual considering an abortion are different.
- Post Abortion Stress Syndrome (PASS) is not recognized by the American Medical Association or the Canadian Medical Association.
- Studies have shown no association between breast cancer and abortion.
- There are many barriers for people accessing abortion.
- SHORE Centre does not perform abortions, however we will support you and provide you with the information you need to have an abortion.

Abortion in Waterloo Region

- Grand River Hospital, Freeport Site, 3570 King Street E Kitchener
- Call **519 749 4254** ask for Brigid to make an apt (self refer)
- Up to 13 weeks gestation
- Covered by OHIP, must have OHIP card with you or must pay
- Can bring a support person
- Can have IUD or IUS inserted after procedure




Abortion Pill

- 2015 approved by Health Canada
- slowly becoming available across Canada, not available locally
- The Common Drug Review (CDR) has endorsed Mifegymiso and is recommending that provincial and territorial governments cover the \$300 cost of the medication
- Can be used up to 7 weeks gestation (9 weeks off label)
- **How it works:** blocks progesterone (helps to sustain pregnancy) + causes uterine contractions = similar to an early miscarriage
- Physician training required to prescribe
- World Health Organization lists as an "**essential medicine**" (has been available in France since 1988 and U.S. since 2000)
- Could provide more options to those who live in rural, remote and Northern areas of Canada

Ways to Help Prevent Abortion

- Provide people with Comprehensive Sex Education.
- Make birth control more easily available.
- Improvement of Birth Control Methods.
- Get everyone involved this is not just a women's issue.
- Increase Self-Esteem.
- Destigmatize sexual health, including abortion.





Emergency Contraception


- Plan B, Next Choice NOT abortion pills
- Prevents a pregnancy DOES NOT affect an existing pregnancy
- ECP is less effective in people over 165 lbs.
- ECP may not be effective in people over 175lbs.







The Science of Plan B – Emergency Contraception







Emergency Contraception

- Must be used as soon as possible (from immediately to within 72 hours) after unprotected sexual activity.
- The effectiveness decreases with time.
- contains a large dose of levonorgestrel (a progestin) that works similarly to the birth control pill by preventing ovulation, thickening cervical fluid and thinning the lining of the uterus.
- Emergency contraception is an over-the-counter medication, no prescription needed (it may be kept behind the counter)
- can be purchased at any pharmacy, costing anywhere from \$21 \$45.
