#### **Community Outreach**

SHORE Centre works to address the emerging needs of our community through targeted sexual health programs tailored to meet the unique needs of underserved and at-risk groups.



#### **Just4Girls & Just4Guys**

Our Just4Guys and Just4Girls programs are targeted to boys in grade 8 and girls in grade 5 and 6. The program provides participants with age-appropriate information on sexual health, healthy relationships and promotes positive selfesteem. More than 80 children participated in the program in 2017-18.

#### **Arabic Newcomer Sexual Health Groups**

In response to the wave of Syrian refugees to Waterloo Region we partnered with several settlement services to adapt our Newcomer Women's Health Program to meet their unique cultural needs. We offered three Arabic programs for women and designed a new program for Arabic men to be piloted in April 2017.



#### **Great SEXpectations**

Great SEXpectations is an interactive play designed to empower teens to make informed decisions about their relationships, sexual health and sexuality. It was awarded the Bentley Prize for Excellence in 2016.

#### **SexAbility**

In 2016 we held focus groups with adults with developmental disabilities to design a new program based on how they wanted to learn about their bodies, sexuality and relationships.
