It is no secret the current political climate in the US after the fall of Roe last year as well as around the world focused on eliminating reproductive choice including access to abortion care is why it is so vitally important for SHORE Centre to continue to be Waterloo Region's trusted source to provide inclusive and equitable reproductive health care and accurate and inclusive sexual health education for folks in our community, throughout Ontario and across Canada. And it is equally important for all of us to recognize that while Canadian laws are different, barriers to accessing abortion care remains an enormous issue in Canada, particularly in rural areas where it is limited or nonexistent. We need to change the narrative about abortion - abortion is a healthcare procedure and a critical part of bodily autonomy. It can be an easy choice as well as a difficult choice. Abortion stigma creates shame, judgement, and violence. This needs to stop. Period.

A message from Executive Director TK Pritchard

Another year has passed, and here at SHORE Centre we have continued to grow to meet the increasingly complex demand, adapted to address emerging community needs, and innovated to ensure we are providing the best possible education, counselling, clinical services and care. As we have grappled with not only the fall of Roe V Wade, but also the ongoing attacks on reproductive rights globally and right here in Canada, the team's dedication and passion has remained steadfast. This kind of work is emotional, personal, and values driven - meaning it's deeply impactful for our staff, board, volunteers and community. It is a privilege for me to witness the ongoing care the team brings to their work each and every day to ensure that our community has inclusive access to services and resources as well as their commitment to advocate for reproductive rights beyond our region. I am often asked how I stay engaged in this work and while there are many answers to that question, one of the most enduring reasons is the gift of learning from and being endlessly inspired by our team and the surrounding community.

This year brought both change and stabilization to the organization. After the unfortunate closure of Our Place, we were very grateful to offer a home for the Stork Secrets program which provides vital supports to expectant and postpartum parents who are adjusting to new parenthood and/or experiencing perinatal mood disorders. Stork Secrets is one of the only no-cost supports offering perinatal specific care in our region and we are thankful for the work of Our Place and their trust in us to continue their legacy and life-saving work. The parenting programming team also developed a new prenatal education series for 2SLGBTQ+ families, Pride and Joy, which offers gender affirming and inclusive education around pregnancy, childbirth and postpartum care. Pride and Joy was developed after ongoing community feedback about a lack of resources which truly centre queer and trans experiences and we are thrilled to work to address this need.

Our education team has been working hard to overhaul all of our education resources to ensure they are up to date and responsive to the intersectional identities of the young people in our community, providing relevant, engaging, and inclusive workshops. This year the team also debuted our sexual health educator training program, a multi-week intensive course which shares our knowledge and approach to expand the capacity of sexual health educators across the province. As we continue to face an increasingly complex and hostile environment around sexual health education, and particularly surrounding conversations related to queer and trans inclusion, the work of our education team has become more important than ever. I would implore those who value this work to consider donating to our education programs as they are largely funded by donations and community support.

Finally, thanks to funding from the Community Services Recovery Fund, we have begun to explore filling a significant gap for our local trans and non-binary community: medical care and support. While this project has many moving pieces and will take time to implement, I have endless gratitude for the team's recognition of this need and efforts to ensure that trans and non-binary people have all the support we need right here in our own community.

This year has brought these projects and so many more. It's impossible to capture in a single letter the work of the organization and incredible team. Thank you to the staff, board, volunteers, donors and entire community for your essential work to prioritize gender equity and bodily autonomy. Thank you for the unbelievable privilege of being able to walk alongside you as we fight for a community, for a province, and for a world which upholds reproductive rights, queer and trans inclusion, disability justice, racial equity and more.

### EDUCATION

In 2022-2023 our education team provided most of our school and community workshops in-person, while allowing the flexibility for virtual lessons when needed. This year we focused on new educational opportunities such as monthly birth control webinars and increasing capacity for sex education by developing a highly anticipated Sex Educator Bootcamp which will provide community members with the knowledge and skills to be sexual health educators.

### STORK SECRETS

Stork Secrets is a peer support program formerly operated by Our Place, which found a new home at SHORE Centre in July 2022. The weekly perinatal mental health group is for expectant and postpartum parents experiencing some challenges to the adjustment of new parenthood, or who may be experiencing some form of perinatal mood and/or anxiety disorder (PMAD).
