For Those Who Are 24 And Under

Region of Waterloo Public Health offers subsidized birth control (pill, patch, ring, injection, IUD). A patient can make an appointment or find out information about drop-in clinics by calling 519-883-2267 or by visiting the public health <u>website</u>.

For Students

Public High Schools in the Waterloo Region District School Board

 All public high schools within Waterloo Region have a public health nurse on site for one afternoon each week. The nurse can prescribe and dispense most methods of birth control right at the school

Wilfrid Laurier University, University of Waterloo and Conestoga College

- Have pharmacies where prescriptions can be filled
- Offer student insurance to help cover the cost of prescriptions

For Anyone

Does the patient have health insurance through any of the following?

- School health benefits plan (university and college students)
- Parent or guardian
- Employer
- Ontario Works (OW) advise patient to talk to their OW worker
- Ontario Disability Benefits Plan (ODSP) advise patient to talk to their ODSP worker

Compassionate Contraceptive Assistance Program

 Any physician can register here. This program provides birth control to those who may not otherwise be able to afford birth control with access to it. Most methods available (pill, patch, ring, injection, IUD, IUS). Supply is limited.
