

Road to Parenthood Instructions

Simply place the cards in the proper order. The cards are the steps to planning and giving birth vaginally, without medication, to a child which was conceived through sexual intercourse.

Can be played with groups as small as two and as large as 21. There are 21 cards in total.

It should also be discussed that each birth is different and may not go as planned.

Order of Cards:

1. Decision to have a child
2. Good pre-natal care (e.g. nutrition, exercise, vitamins)
3. Sexual intercourse
4. Ejaculation, sperm enters vagina
5. Sperm swim into vagina, through the cervix into the uterus and fallopian tubes
6. Some sperm meet ovum (egg) in fallopian tubes (if ovulation has occurred)
7. One sperm enters ovum's outer membrane (fertilization)
8. Fertilized egg (zygote) travels to uterus
9. Zygote implants on wall of uterus
10. Pregnancy confirmed with a pregnancy test
11. Nine months pass
12. Labour pains
13. Contractions of uterus open cervix
14. Water breaks
15. Baby enters birth canal (vagina)
16. Muscles propel baby through vagina
17. Babies head crowns
18. Birth of baby
19. Umbilical cord is cut
20. Delivery of placenta
21. New life with baby begins
