Sexual Health Resources in Waterloo Region

Birth Control:

- Hormonal methods of birth control and the IUD require a prescription from a Health Care Provider such as a Family Physician, a Nurse Practitioner, or a Physician at a walk-in-clinic
- Contraceptive foam and film can be bought at drug and grocery stores
- Health Services at Universities and Colleges can prescribe birth control
- Public Health will *only* see people 24 years of age and younger to prescribe birth control. They distribute birth control at a reduced cost.

- Not all physicians will insert an IUD or an IUS, call the Sexual Health Options, Resources and Education (SHORE) Centre if you are having difficulties finding a provider for this procedure
- **SHORE Centre** does not prescribe or distribute birth control

Emergency Contraception (ECP):

You DO NOT need a prescription to purchase Emergency Contraception (ECP, Plan B, the morning after pill, NextChoice). It can be bought at most pharmacies for approximately \$40. It is also sold at Walmart for approximately \$28 and Costco for approximately \$21.

- Public Health distributes Emergency Contraception for \$15, unfortunately they are not open on weekends or on holidays and require an appointment
- Health Services at Universities and Colleges can distribute ECP

Pregnancy Testing:

- Health Care Providers such as Family Physicians and Physicians at walk-in clinics can provide pregnancy tests
- Pregnancy tests can be purchased at drug and grocery stores, these tests are extremely accurate
- SHORE Centre and Public Health provide pregnancy testing free of charge

STI Testing

- Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing can be performed by your Family Physician
- A Pap test does not necessarily include STI testing, if you are unsure if you have received STI testing ask your Health Care Provider
- Public Health provides STI testing for anyone in Waterloo Region, either by appointment or at their drop-in times

Sexual Health Information

 Cervical screening (Pap test) is recommended every three years beginning at age 21 for anyone with a cervix who are, or have been, sexually active. Sexual activity includes anal, oral and vaginal intercourse, as well as digital intercourse (fingering) and sharing of sex toys, with a partner of any gender.

- People with a cervix who have not been sexually active by the age of 21 can delay cervical screening. For more information visit the Ontario Cervical Screening Program website

- The Waterloo Wellington Breast Centre at Freeport Health Centre has a regional breast assessment service, as well as the Ontario Breast Screening Program

- Testicular self-exams should be conducted monthly starting at puberty. Testicular cancer is the most common form of cancer in men between the ages of 15 and 29. For more information visit the Canadian Cancer Society at <u>www.cancer.ca</u>
- Only condoms help prevent pregnancy AND the spread of STIs, other forms of birth control only help prevent pregnancy
- Breast feeding is not a reliable form of birth control, you can get pregnant while breast feeding. Talk to your Health Care Provider about birth control options while breast feeding.
- The legal age of sexual consent in Canada is 16.
